# **CITY ELECTIONS 2022**

City of London elections were due to be held in 2021 but were deferred to 2022 due to the Covid pandemic. The elections duly took place in the twenty-five wards of the City on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> March. The result is a substantially changed Court of Common Council. Seventy three members were standing for re-election, sixty-two of them were successful meaning that there are thirty-eight new members.

In this ward of Farringdon Without, the Temple and Farringdon Together team of ten were standing for reelection en bloc for the ten available seats with only one challenger, Ellen Goodwin, a Labour candidate. The result was a resounding success for Temple and Farringdon Together as follows

Ellen Goodwin achieved 108 votes. Across the City eleven members standing for re-election were unsuccessful in some close votes. However, six wards had uncontested elections.

Greg Lawrence commented – "We are delighted to have been re-elected and thank all those who supported us. I would like to congratulate everyone who was re-elected across the City and commiserate with those who were not. In particular, we welcome the thirty-eight new members to the Court of Common Council. These results have ensured a more diverse and representative council than ever before."

## THE BOAR'S HEAD CEREMONY

History identifies that the Boar's Head ceremony dates back to 1343 when the Butchers were slaughtering in Smithfield and experiencing great difficulty in removing the blood, guts and ordure. The Lord Mayor of the day, John Hammond, allowed the guild to purchase a small piece of land giving them access to the river Fleet, thereby allowing them to dispose of the animal waste away from the City streets.

In return for this the Butchers and their successors were forever more to render to the Lord Mayor of the City of London a Christmas Boar's Head. As we delivered the Boar's head on 8 February 2022, we were technically late, however the Lord Mayor did not complain.

Whilst the requirement is annual, I understand that the ceremony did lapse and was reintroduced in the mid-1900s.

Health and safety rules prevent us from processing with the actual Boar's Head, this is delivered to the Mansion House in a refrigerated vehicle, having been crafted by Defence School Food Services Training wing. This year was the largest they have ever made and ate very well.

The procession left Butchers' Hall after an enjoyable lunch, and led by the Epping Forest Pipe Band, we set off for Mansion House carrying a replica Boar's Head.

In previous years we have been escorted by the City of London Police on bicycles, but for reasons which are not entirely clear to me, we are now required to apply for a road closure permit and hire a security company, both of which add considerable cost to a twenty-minute walk through the City of London.

I am extremely grateful to the Smithfield Market Tenants' Association and Liveryman Peter Sturge MBE for sponsoring the event to cover these costs.

On arrival at the Mansion House, we are invited to partake of the real Boar's Head, after presenting the Lord Mayor with a Butcher's Apron bearing the Worshipful Company of Butchers crest, he is invited to carve the first slice. Everyone agreed that this is a special event and, after nearly two years of lockdown, it was good to be back in the City keeping up tradition and celebrating our history.

# BARTS MEDICAL SCHOOL NAME CHANGE OUTRAGE

Barts and the London School of Medicine and Dentistry is being threatened with a name change to Queen Mary University Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry sparking off a wave of outrage among doctors, students and alumni. A change.org petition has attracted over 16,000 signatures protesting the change.

The medical school was set up as St Bartholomew's Hospital medical college in 1123 and the hospital celebrates its 900<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2023.

Known worldwide as Barts and London the medical school survived the Great Fire of London and the Reformation when Henry VIII threatened its closure. Instead it was transferred to the City of London Corporation. Queen Mary University of London says it wishes to promote a strong coherent identity following the merger in 1995.
